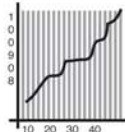

Is your PC ready for Vista?

Microsoft has launched its "Get Ready" campaign to help consumers prepare for the early 2007 arrival of **Windows Vista**. The first step is to determine your pc's type.

A computer is classified "Vista Capable" or "Premium Ready", depending on its configuration. "Premium Ready" computers can perform more advanced functions including the Aero graphics interface.

A Vista Capable computer requires:

- An 800 MHz processor
- 512 MB of RAM
- A DirectX 9 capable graphics card

A Premium Ready computer requires:

- A 1 GHz processor, 32 or 64 bit
- 1 GB of RAM
- A Windows Aero2 capable graphics card
- 128 MB graphics memory
- 40 GB of hard drive capacity with 15 GB free space
- A DVD-ROM drive
- Audio output capability
- Internet access capability



Keep these requirements in mind if you're planning on changing your pc soon!

Save reports in PDF format

All reports generated from Optosys®2 can now be saved in PDF (Portable Document Format) format. This format is a universal file format created by Adobe Systems to facilitate the distribution of documents.

Follow these simple instructions to create your own PDF documents:

1. Generate your report.
2. When the report is displayed on your screen, click on the "File Save" button located at the top left-hand side of the screen (reverse #1).
3. Next, select where you want to save the report (reverse #2).
4. Enter a file name (reverse #3).
5. Click on "Save" (reverse #4).

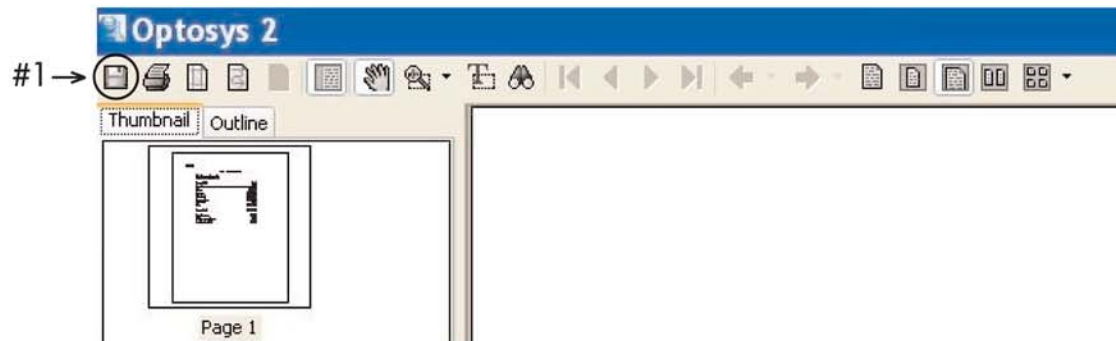
You now have a PDF document that can be viewed by anyone possessing Acrobat Reader from Adobe Systems. This software is free and can be downloaded from www.adobe.com/fr/products/acrobat/readstep2.html.
