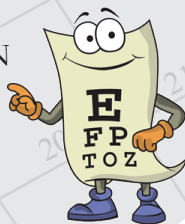

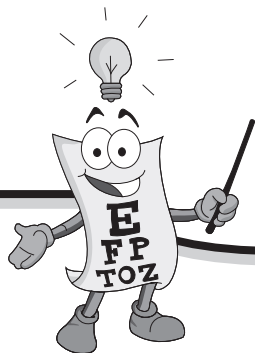

## Microsoft extends Windows XP deadline by five months

Following excessive criticism from Windows Vista users, Microsoft has announced that they will continue selling the Windows XP operating system and make it available to computer manufacturers until June 30, 2008.

While operating systems are generally available for a period of four years following their launch, Windows XP has been in operation since 2001. Production delays, which led to Windows Vista being launched in January of this year, made it necessary for Microsoft to leave Windows XP on the market longer than planned.

Users criticized Vista's lack of compatibility with existing software, as well as the system's requirement for resources that exceed the capacities of older computers. Manufacturers responded to these concerns by promoting Windows XP, despite the millions of dollars invested by Microsoft in promoting Vista.

Didier Burdinat, Director of the Windows division of Microsoft France, states the following: "In extending the deadline to June 30, 2008, from January 30, 2008, as planned, we are simply responding to the requests from multinational computer manufacturers who are repeating what our customers have been saying".
